## Top principal

Middle school students can be as volatile as an Icelandic volcano. But Duniway Middle School Principal Cathy Carnahan '73 celebrates her students' mercurial nature in the spirit of the McMinnville school's motto, "Carpe Diem."

Carnahan, who has led Duniway since 2004, recently was recognized as Oregon Middle School Principal of the Year by the Oregon Association of Secondary School Administrators and the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

Sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders are inquisitive and excited about learning, she said. "They really value relationships. As adults, if we're able to help them focus and make good decisions, it can have such a positive impact on how they approach life later. So much of their identity is formed right here."

Carnahan and her husband, Linfield Athletic Director Scott Carnahan '73, met in high school and married after Cathy's sophomore year at Pacific Lutheran University. 
