Passion for history garners award

Erin Nooy's passion for American history helped earn her a prestigious award. Nooy '05, who teaches social studies at McMinnville High School, received the 2007 James Madison Fellowship. The award, presented to only one teacher in each state, provides up to \$24,000 toward completion of a master's degree in American history.

Nooy is working toward a master's in education at George Fox University but is taking many U.S. history courses for her content area. This summer she will take six credit-hours focusing on the Constitution, at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C.

This is Nooy's third year at Mac High, where she teaches global studies, as well as American history. She will take a group of students to the Model UN in Eugene in April.

Nooy says her classes and especially student-teaching helped her feel really prepared as she began a teaching career. "Also, knowing anytime that I could call on my professors at Linfield was great," she says. "Bob McCann wrote me a letter of recommendation for the fellowship. He's been a huge help."

According to its Web site, the James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation, based in Washington, D.C., was established by Congress in 1986 to improve teaching about the Constitution in secondary schools. Funding comes from Congress and contributions from individuals, foundations and corporations.

Wildcat softball champs share George Pasero Award

The Linfield College softball team was honored with a share of the George Pasero Team Award in recognition of its 2007 NCAA Division III national championship.

Given annually to the state's outstanding team or organization, the award was presented to Linfield team members at the 56th Oregon Sports Awards, held at the Tiger Woods Center on the Nike World Campus. Linfield shared the Pasero award with the Oregon State baseball team and the Oregon cross country team, which also won national titles during 2007.

The Wildcats, who fought off elimination twice at the NCAA Finals in May, finished their remarkable season with a record 45 wins while becoming the first women's team from Linfield to earn a national title.

It also marked the sixth time that a Linfield sports team has received the Pasero Award. The Linfield football program also won or shared the Pasero award in 1982, 1984, 1986, 2003 and 2004.



Library only NW site for Alexander Hamilton exhibit

Alexander Hamilton, the first U.S. Secretary of the Treasury at age 32, is the focus of a traveling exhibition that will make its only Northwest appearance at the Jereld

R. Nicholson Library Feb. 28-April 18.

Alexander Hamilton: The Man Who Made Modern America tells the story of Hamilton's astonishing rise from an orphaned immigrant to George Washington's war time aide and Secretary of the Treasury. He was a complex and controversial figure – a Revolutionary War patriot and soldier, financial and legal genius, and an ardent opponent of slavery. He was the chief architect of many of the financial, political and legal institutions so familiar to Americans today.

The exhibit was organized by the New-York Historical Society, the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History and the American Library Association. It has been made possible in part through a major grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Three special lectures by nationally known scholars will be held in conjunction with the exhibition:

Thursday, March 6: Forgotten Abolitionists: Antislavery Writers in Hamilton's Era, James Basker, Barnard College;

Thursday, April 3: Mr. Jefferson's Alexander Hamilton, Barbara Oberg, Princeton University; Tuesday, April 15: Why Did the Democrats of the 1790s Hate Alexander Hamilton So Much? Seth Cotlar, Willamette University.
