In Spain, the grandmother usually takes care of the grandchildren after school and serves as the primary support within the family. In my personal experience, I grew up with a similar dynamic. My grandmother took care of everyone within my family and maintained the household, however, life in the U.S. tends to be surrounded by work with a lower emphasis on family time.

The interview experience taught me that different perspectives and cultural understanding are incredibly important. I have learned about differences that exist between my origin country, the U.S.A, and Spain, and I feel like I now have a better perspective of the culture here and a stronger sense of identity.
