Alleta Maier '18 was 12 years old the first time she heard the term "strong force," and watched entranced as her middle school science teacher hopped around the room demonstrating scientific principles.

Fast forward a decade, add the power of Linfield College, and Maier has found her calling: particle physicist. Maier, who earned degrees in physics and mathematics in May, is setting off to do things her 12-year-old-self only dreamed about. She will investigate strong force as part of a doctoral program at the University of Wisconsin, which includes three years of study in Geneva, Switzerland, working with the world's largest and most powerful particle collider.

"Linfield's phenomenal undergraduate research program has opened doors for me," Maier says. "It's incredible work and I'm very fortunate and very excited."

Maier immersed herself in research from day one at Linfield, taking part in iFOCUS, a pre-orientation program for science. Summer research stints with professors in math and physics followed, which led to a prestigious Duke University Research Experience for Undergraduates in particle science.

"At Linfield, my education was not restricted to the physical sciences,"

says Maier, a gender studies minor who also served as vice president of the student body.

"Linfield's liberal arts curriculum has given me a plethora of outlets for my curiosity with both breadth and depth of knowledge."








