Rock Marks Vineyard Site

Bjelland Vineyards are located two miles north of Tenmile. Just turn on Reston Road and look for the big rock, a historical landmark which is featured on the Bjelland wine label. The vineyards are part of a 200-acre parcel of land surrounded by mountains.

Established in 1968, present plantings cover 28 acres—85 per cent of which is Cabernet Sauvignon. Other plantings are: Gamay Beaujolois, Pinot Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Pinot

Blanc, Zinfandel, Gewurtztraminer, Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc, and several hundred fine table varieties near the future winery site.

Twelve hundred gallons of quality table wine are aging on the premises of Bonded Oregon Winery No. 47. Capacity of the first phase of the new winery will be 2,500 gallons. The first phase of the new winery will be completed about July 1, 1970. At that time samples will be

available from 4 to 6 p.m. daily, Saturdays and Sundays 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Bjelland Vineyards is presently interested in propagating quality table wine grapes on approximately 12,500 varietal grape plants and promoting a multi-million dollar wine industry in Oregon.
