The PLACE Student Fellows are a pilot part of the PLACE program for the 2013-2014 year. These fellows are nominated by the Linfield Faculty and chosen by the PLACE Faculty Fellows. They collaborate with the PLACE Faculty Fellows to bring ideas, discussions, events, and speakers to campus, and function as ambassadors between these events and speakers, the students that attend, and the faculty that organizes many of these visits. Each fellow is charged with the task of creating and running an event relating to the program's theme, striving to interest the student body and inspire conversations across the disciplines at Linfield.

Megan Schwab

A junior International Relations Major, Schwab is also working towards minors in History and Gender Studies. Heavily involved as an officer of the Linfield Debate team, she has won and placed in multiple British Parliamentary Debate competitions and with her Persuasive speech in Individual Events. She traveled with select members of the team under the umbrella of the International Debate Education Association (IDEA) foundation to China, where she led workshops teaching debate to beginners and took second in the subsequent international debate tournament. Schwab recently took first place in the Frederick Douglass Speaking Competition on campus, and was also just appointed Co-Student Director of the Linfield Writing Center.

In addition, Schwab took first with her partner at a demonstration debate the previous year at the Salem Penitentiary, where she returned this summer to teach the beginning inmate debate class. A collaborative research grant funding 10 weeks of study with advisor/professor Patrick Cottrell has filled her most recent summer days, in which she is examining issues surrounding the

lack of accountability in United Nations Peacekeeping Operations in countries such as Haiti. A passionate advocate for the value of the liberal arts education as well as an active engager of the community, Schwab hopes to utilize her leadership, persuasive speaking, research, and teaching skills to incite student interest in the PLACE program.

A senior Religious Studies Major at Linfield College, Ribeiro also is seeking minors in Political Science, Sociology, and Gender Studies.
