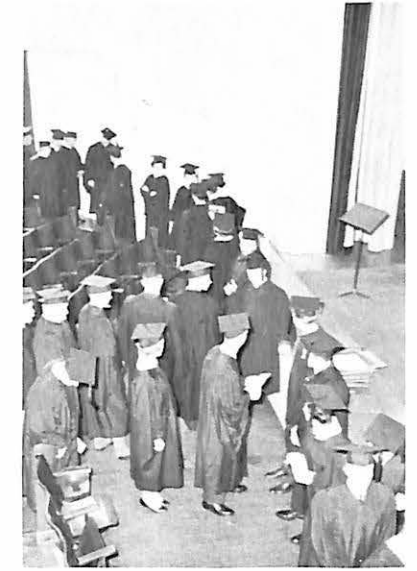

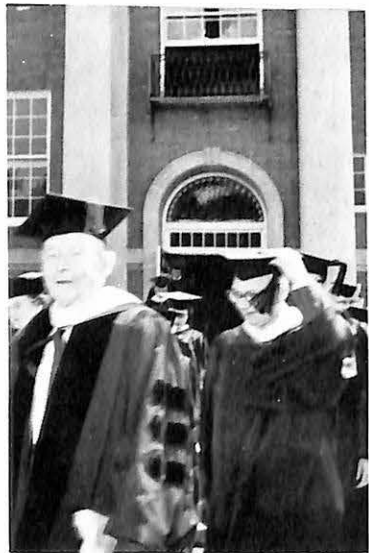

Linfield won its fourth straight NWC baseball crown and faced Portland State for the right to compete in the NAIA finals in St. Joseph, Mo., June 5-9. But Portland State won the first two games out of the three game series and won the berth in the NAIA finals at Monmouth, Oregon.

Despite the two losses to Portland State Linfield boasted a 16-9 season record and smashed their way through the NWC with a 14-1 record. Their only conference loss was to Pacific, 3-2. The other eight losses came at the hands of the University of Oregon and Oregon State University.

Since Roy "Lefty" Helser has coached at Linfield he has had eight NWC baseball crowns in 13 years. His teams have won four consecutive crowns in the past four seasons.

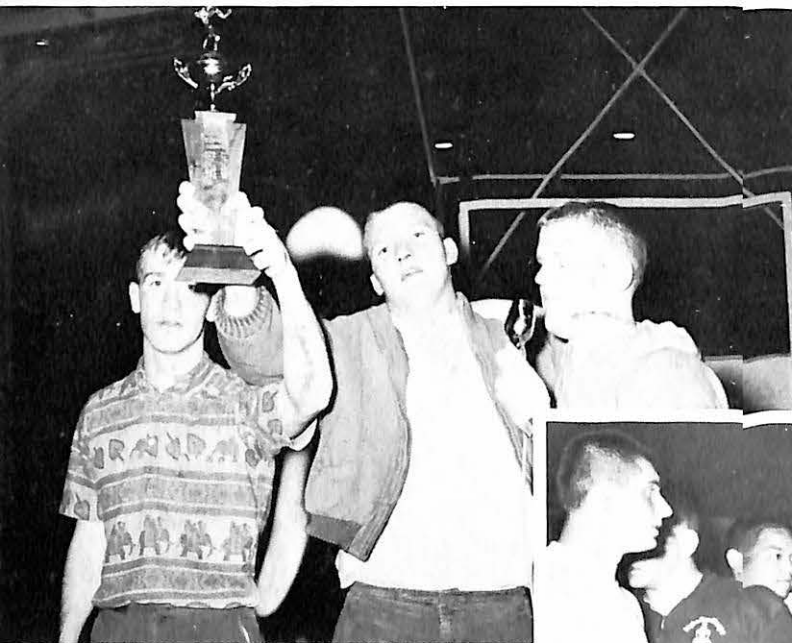
