Adding to the permanent beauty of Linfield, Queen Linda and escort, Jack Ostlund break ground for a rhododendron.







### *L-men see tough season*

The 1968 track and field season was a disappointment to the Wildcats who finished with an overall 0-5 win-loss slate. Despite the team tally, cindermen John Venemon and Keith Shriver came through with impressive showings. Venemon, who broke his personal high jump record of 6'6", and leaped 6'8" for the conference top spot. At Lewis and Clark, Shriver clocked in at 48.2 in the 440 for an improvement of the 1957-58 NWC record of 48.4. At the same meet, Westfall bettered the 1965 record of 1:59.2 by taking the 880 in 1:56.7. Other standouts for L-men were John Sadowski in the 440 and Joe Robillard in the 220.


The team was coached by Hal Smith and his assistant Frank McNatt.

*1968 baseball record*


The Wildcat baseball team had a record of 13 wins and five losses in finishing in second place behind Pacific in the 1968 Northwest Conference race.



Shawn Mosley keeps his pitching arm in shape while waiting for the game to start.




