



The Wildcats took 4th place in the NWC and earned the same ranking in the NAIA District No. 2 meet in Ashland, Oregon







Oregon's Gov. Tom McCall, an honorary alumnus of Linfield, speaks at the Alumni banquet.




Dr. Gordon C. Bjork was officially inaugurated as president by Linfield's Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Dr. Philip E. Renshaw.
