Shawn Chen '87 receives honorary degree

Shawn Chen '87, founder and chairman of Sias University. received an honorary degree at the 2024 Commencement, which was held May 26. He also served as the commencement speaker, giving an address that highlighted



the impact Linfield played in his career and how it will continue to guide the graduates' lives in the future.

Chen, who holds a master's degree in education from Linfield, founded Sias University in Zhengzhou, China. The university was designed to incorporate Western liberal arts traditions in a Chinese higher education setting. Since its founding in 1998, it has grown to more than 36,000 undergraduate students.

In addition to his work at Sias University, Chen is a leader within the United Nations System, as the president of the UN's World Federation of United Nations Associations (WFUNA). WFUNA works to strengthen and improve the UN through training programs, events and partnerships, including many Model U.N. programs around the world. He is also president of the International Association of University Presidents (IAUP) and the co-founder of Plug and Play China, a subsidiary of the renowned Plug and Play venture capital incubation company in Silicon Valley. He has established incubation centers throughout China.

More recently, Chen was instrumental in signing a memorandum of understanding between Linfield University and Sias University in September 2023 that calls for the development of a joint-supervision dual degree program and possible student, faculty and curriculum exchanges.

First graduate of 3+2 wine program returns to Oregon wines

After learning about wine at Linfield and throughout Europe, Emma Anderson '20 is back in the Willamette Valley, starting a new role at Nicolas-Jay Estate in Newberg.

Anderson was the first person to enroll in the university's unique 3+2 wine program, where students graduate with their bachelor's degree in wine studies from Linfield and a master's degree in vine, wine and terroir management from Ecole Superieure D'Agriculture in France, in only five years.

As part of the master's program, Anderson had the opportunity to study wine in Spain, France, Italy and Portugal. Her time abroad was cut short due to the pandemic, and she completed her thesis back in the United States.

"The program allows you to immerse yourself in the Old-World wine regions," she said. "You really have to know the background in order to create something new."

Experiencing finance across America

January Term courses offer students an expanded academic experience in a compressed time frame. They are held online, in McMinnville, throughout the U.S. or in another country. Years later, many alumni remember these courses as some of the most impactful of their Linfield experience.

After a decade-long hiatus, faculty emeritus Scott Chambers came out of retirement to offer students a unique January Term opportunity in 2024. He and Madeleine Romero, visiting associate professor of business, accompanied a small group of students on a whirlwind adventure as part of the Finance Seminar/Securities Market class.

The group met with finance professionals in McMinnville, Portland, Seattle and New York City. In total, the class made 15 visits and had an opportunity to discuss careers in finance with more than 40 Linfield alumni, many of whom were prior January Term participants themselves.

"I learned that future success isn't just about what you know, but also about who you know and how you leverage those connections," Connor Stevens '24 said.

In addition to the site visit, students participated in two alumni events - one in Seattle and one in New York - where they had the opportunity to network with alumni from various eras and career fields.

Though there was a great deal of talk about careers, investments, ETFs, hedge funds and other finance topics, there



were plenty of opportunities to have fun and explore the cities as well. Funded by donations from alumni, the students attended two Broadway shows ("Moulin Rouge" and "Gutenberg! The Musical!") as well as the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, for example.

The lessons learned, the skills developed, the friendships forged and the memories made will last well beyond their time at Linfield.

"The ability to meet professionals and establish connections allowed me to explore career opportunities," Alaina Clark '24 said. "It was a life-changing opportunity."

Damian Williams, a Linfield faculty member featured in the Spring 2023 issue of "Linfield Magazine," died on June 12, 2024, after a hard-fought battle with cancer. Williams was an assistant professor of practice in the Linfield University School of Business. Since his arrival in fall 2022, he transformed the school's internship (or as he named it – "industry experience") program and created the Front Office Sports group that gave students an opportunity to work with real-world sports clients across the Pacific Northwest. He was honored as the university's R.J. McIntyre Distinguished Professor in May 2024. Before coming to Linfield, Williams had a successful career in sports business and as the softball coach at Willamette University. He is survived by his wife Genesis and son Everson.

Alumni musicians take the stage at NW Media Fest

In October 2023, Linfield University hosted its second annual NW Media Fest - a four-day celebration of media featuring workshops led by industry experts on entertainment, movies, music, journalism and comics.

Singer-songwriter Jessie Goergen '12, known professionally as Jessie G, was one of the featured guests. The Nashville-based performing artist, who originally hailed from Brookings, offered sessions to students on the writing process and succeeding in the music industry. On Wednesday night, she and percussionist/guitarist Christian Santangelo '15 performed on the Delkin Recital Hall stage.

The pair met at Linfield, first performing together at Wildstock in 2012, where they opened for Macklemore. At the time, neither could have predicted that they would reunite in Nashville and be performing together nearly 11 years later.

After graduating with degrees in political science and vocal performance, Jessie won a "Battle of the Bands" competition in 2013, earning the opportunity to open for country legend Gretchen Wilson. Jessie would eventually tour with Wilson and released her first single "Army Ranger" through Wilson's label, Redneck Records, in 2018. Her first album - self-titled "Jessie G" - was produced in 2019.

Santangelo, who came to Linfield from Mulkilteo, Washington, moved to the country-music heartland in Nashville shortly after earning his bachelor's degree in music. In addition to touring regularly with Jessie and others, he also works as a studio musician and producer.

When COVID-19 hit the entertainment industry, Jessie decided to become an independent artist, obtaining full rights to her previously recorded songs from Wilson. Since then, she has released seven new singles, including "You Lit a Fire"

in 2023. She has also continued touring - usually accompanied by Santangelo – with prominent artists such as Jarrod Niemann, Sara Evans and Brothers Osborne.

Even though Jessie is no longer signed to the Redneck Records label, she and Wilson have announced plans to release a duet in 2024.
